RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS FOR THE  
GOVERNING BODY OF THE  
TOWN OF WHEATLAND

A special meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Wheatland, Platte County, State of Wyoming was held in the Council Room of the Town Hall, on November 22, 2005 at 5:40 P.M. for the purpose of discussion on sewer damage claims, letter of support for designation of highway 26 as a scenic by-way and the moratorium on off premises signs.

Mayor Dingman called the meeting to order and upon roll call it was found that the following were present: Councilmen Wilhelm, Hensel and Wilson, Councilwoman Allen. Also present was Clerk/Treasurer, Cindy Kahler, Wastewater Dept. Head, Pete Delgado and Wastewater Foreman, Gary Lipps.

Mayor Dingman stated that a discussion on the moratorium recently placed on off-premises sign age needed to be added to the agenda. A motion was made by Councilman Wilson and seconded by Councilman Hensel to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried 4-0.

Three sewer claims were presented for damages that occurred when the sewer main plugged up and backups occurred in the residences. The claims were from Ryan & Cindy Amundson in the amount of \$4,258.74 for damages on August 15, 2005, John & Kelly Atterbury in the amount of \$5,334.01 for damages on October 24, 2005 and Lloyd & Maxine Koerwitz in the amount of \$252.25 for damages on October 12, 2005. A motion was made by Councilman Wilhelm and seconded by Wilson consider all three claims at once and pay for the clean up portion of the claim only and not damages. Motion carried 3-1.

A Resolution in support of the expansion of Camp Guernsey was presented. A motion was made by Councilman Wilson and seconded by Councilwoman Allen to adopt the Resolution in support of Camp Guernsey as presented. Motion carried 4-0. The Resolution is as follows:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Military Department has proposed there be a significant expansion of the Wyoming National Guard Training facility at Camp Guernsey; and

WHEREAS, the understood purpose of such is expansion is to maintain facilitate, and enhance the scope of military training available at Camp Guernsey.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town of Wheatland through its

Governing Body, hereby expresses its appreciation and gratitude for the service of the men and women of the Wyoming National Guard.

BE IF FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Council of the Town of Wheatland expresses support for the expansion of the National Guard Training facility in Guernsey. The Town of Wheatland considers expansion of Camp Guernsey to be beneficial to the economic development, stability, and growth of Platte County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Council of the Town of Wheatland recommends that as Camp Guernsey is expanded, the State of Wyoming take steps to make sure the Town of Guernsey's infra-structure needs are addressed and partially funded by the Wyoming Military Department.

A letter in support for the designation of highway 26 as a scenic by-way by the Dept. Of Transportation was presented. A motion was made by Councilman Hensel and seconded by Councilman Wilhelm to approve the letter in support for the designation of highway 26 as a scenic by-way as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

Councilman Wilson stated that he would like to have the sign that is being proposed for the Middle School be exempted from the moratorium as the application was completed and signed prior to the moratorium being placed on off-premises signs at the Council meeting on November 14, 2005. Clerk/Treasurer, Cindy Kahler stated that the school had applied for a special use permit to place an off-premises sign on the property at the Middle School on November 14, 2005 prior to the Council meeting. A motion was made by Councilman Wilson and seconded by Councilman Hensel to exempt the proposed sign at the Middle School from the moratorium and allow the special use application to move through the process. Motion carried 4-0.

With no further business to come before the Governing Body, Mayor Dingman adjourned the meeting at 6:30 P.M.. The next regular meeting of the Town Council will be held on December 12, 2005.
