Mayor Hensel read a proclamation for Constitution Week - September 17 - 23, 2008.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, September 17, 2008, marks the two hundred twenty-first anniversary of the drafting of the Constitution of the United State of America by the Constitutional of the United State of America by the Constitution Convention, and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to accord official recognition of this magnificent document and its memorable anniversary; and to the patriotic celebration which will commemorate the occasion; and

WHEREAS, Public Law 915 guarantees the issuing of a proclamation each year by the President of the United State of America designating September 17 through 23 as as Constitution Week,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Dean Hensel by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the Town of Wheatland in the state of Wyoming do hereby proclaim the week of September 17 through 23 as CONSTITUTION WEEK and ask our citizens to reaffirm the ideals of the Framers of the Constitution had by vigilantly protecting the freedoms guaranteed to us through the guardian of our liberties, remembering that lost rights may never be regained.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Town of Wheatland, Wyoming, to be affixed the 17th day of September of the year of our Lord two thousand and eight.

A catering permit application from Vimbo's/Dusty Boots was presented for October 24, 2008 for the Chamber of Commerce Ag. Banquet. A motion was made by Councilman Shoemaker and seconded by Councilman Madsen to approve the catering permit for Vimbo's/Dusty Boots for October 24, 2008 with the applicable fees. Motion carried 3-0.

Mayor Hensel asked if and when the Council would like to hold a Fall Clean-Up for the Town and it was the consensus of the Council that the Town have a Clean-up Week beginning Monday September 22, 2008 and ending Saturday, September 27, 2008. They agreed to waive fees the landfill with the exception of tires and refrigeration units.

With no further business to come before the Governing Body, Mayor Hensel adjourned the meeting at 7:25 P.M.. The next regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Wheatland will be held on Monday, October 13, 2008.
