

Bethany Rose "Betty" Alloway

May 6, 1930-May 30, 1999

Services for Bethany Rose "Betty" Alloway, 69, were held Wednesday, June 2, at 2 p.m. at the Platte Funeral Chapel in Wheatland, with Bishop Dana K. Barnett of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints presiding over the service. Inurnment was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mrs. Alloway died Sunday, May 30, at her home in Wheatland following a short illness with cancer. She was born May 6, 1930 in Sterlingville, N.Y. the daughter of Lester and Caroline (Sterling) Mack. She was reared and educated in Sterlingville, and came to Casper in 1947. She graduated from Natrona County High School in Casper in 1948. She was married to Anthony J. "Tony" Bouzis in Salt Lake City. She lived in Casper until 1954, then in several places prior to going to Alaska in 1967 to homestead with James R. "Jim" Adkinson.

She came back to Wyoming in the early 1990's. She worked at the Shepherd of the Valley Care Center in Casper in the food service department. She was married to Everett L. Alloway on January 16, 1999 at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints Church in Casper. At the time of her death she was residing in Wheatland. She enjoyed fishing and dancing.

She is survived by her husband, Everett, of Wheatland; two daughters, Merry Demarest of Corvallis, Ore. and Deanna Breeden of Palmer, Alaska; two sisters, Leone Ellis of Casper and Lorna Leonard of Thousand Oaks, Calif.; one brother, Roy Mack of Casper; two grandchildren, Joan Demarest of Corvallis and Michael Breeden of Palmer.

She was preceded in death by her parents; two husbands, Tony Bouzis on March 6, 1987 and Jim Adkinson on October 11, 1994; one brother, Merle Mack; and one sister, Luella Pedder.
