Graveside services and inurnment for Florence Vedder Anderson, 103, will be held Thurs., Oct. 31, at 2p.m. in the Wheatland Cemetery at Wheatland. Mrs. Anderson died Wed., Oct. 16, at Platte County Memorial Nursing Home in Wheatland.

She was born July 30, 1899, in Cozad, Nebraska, the daughter of Llwellyn and Frances (Durland) Vedder, and raised on a homestead on Birdwood Creek in the sandhills of Nebraska. In 1918 Mrs. Anderson graduated from North Platte School.

She attended Normal School in Kearney, and taught in country

schools in Nebraska. In Aug., 1921, she married Rex Rutherford Anderson in Golden, Colorado. After living in California, New Mexico, and Colorado, Florence and Rex came to Wheatland in 1930. They built a home and raised their three children. In 1945, they moved to Sunrise, Wyoming, where Florence taught school for 20 years. She received her Bachelor's Degree in Education from the University of Wyoming. When Mrs. Anderson retired in 1965, she and her husband returned to live in Wheatland. They liked to travel, visiting Canada, Alaska, Mexico, Europe, and

around the world.

Florence is survived by three children, Clark Anderson of Glendo, Allegra Anderson and Gigrid see both of Wheatland; a granddaughter, Renee Smathers of Glendo and a great granddaughter, Gillian Smathers also of Glendo.

She was preceded in death by her parents; husband, Rex on Dec. 19, 1984; a sister; and three brothers.
