Platte County Pioneer of 1976 James B. Angle, Sr. died Saturday, April 15, 1978 in the Veterans Administration Hospital of Denver at the age of 84. Last rites were held Wednesday, April 19, 1978 at 10:00 a.m. at the First Christian Church with Dan Barcus officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery.
