

AXFORD, CLARISSA CHAMBERLAIN

January 12, 1896-May 10, 1944

Funeral services were held Tuesday (omission in newspaper) chapel for Mrs. E.J. Axford, 48, who died in the Spears sanitarium in Denver Saturday following a long illness. Christian Science services were read by Mrs. Lois Donaldson. Mrs. Robert Kuns and Don Maxwell, accompanied by Mrs. John Bohmont, sang "The Old Rugged Cross" and "Going Down the Valley".

Clarissa Chamberlain Axford was born in Stratford, Iowa, January 12, 1896 and was united in marriage to E.J. Axford December 20, 1911.

Besides her husband she is survived by a son Francis who is serving in the air corps and stationed at Kearns, Utah; one sister, Mrs. Winnie Hicks of Stratford, Ia., and a brother, Ed Chamberlain of Seattle, Wash.
