George W. Adamson was born May 4, 1881 at Auburn, Nebraska, and passed away in Wheatland at the home of a niece, Dollie Warren on December 1.

Since coming to Wyoming some 20 years ago, he had not taken up any permanent residence. About five years ago he with his wife professed faith and joined the Nazarene church. He was also in sympathy with the Salvation Army work.

In 1920 he was married to Rachel Pierceson at Holyoke, Nebraska and to this union two children were born, George W. and Marie. Surviving are four brothers, Will of Wray, Colorado, John of Ringwood, Oklahoma, Albert of Straton, Nebraska, Frank of Benkleman, Nebraska; five sisters Lizzie Potter and Susie Warning of Benkleman, Nebraska, Blanch Bomblin of Gleine, Oklahoma, Mrs. Cap Crites of Lohoma, Oklahoma and Stella Crites of Hillsdale; one stepson and many other relatives and friends. He was preceded in death by his father and mother, one brother and one sister. He was 56 years old at the time of his death.

Funeral services were conducted from the Copley Funeral home on Sunday, December 4 at 1 p.m. with Rev. I.C. Noyce officiating and burial was made in the local cemetery.
