BARNES, DOROTHY KLASSERT October 26, 1907-1927

The funeral services for Dorothy Klassert Barnes, wife of Roy Barnes, and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Sam Klassert, were held today at the Baptist church at 2 o'clock the Rev. A.C. Mrs. Dorothy Barnes, nee Klassert, was born Oct. 26, 1907, in Gering, Nebraska and died last Tuesday morning at 2:00, in the Wheatland General hospital.
