BARRETT, FRANK CLAWSON March 23, 1860-July 18, 1923

Rev. Frank C. Barrett, who, two months ago, moved to Wheatland from Oxford, Nebr., for his health, died early Wednesday morning at the Wheatland hospital, to which he had been moved on Sunday evening in a comatose condition. Mr. Barrett, who had been acutely ill for some time, was sent a few weeks ago to Denver to be operated for a supposed infection of the mastoid, but without permanent benefit. At the hospital, a careful study was made of his case, which proved to be chronic meningitis, in a stage of which there can be no hopes of recovery.

Mr. Barrett was a well known Baptist minister who had been, for a time, been connected with the educational work of his church. He and Mrs. Barrett came to Wheatland in April to make their home with a daughter, Mrs. J.B. Westley. Even in these short months his influence for good was felt, and he made many friends who will mourn his loss.

At his bedside during his last illness were his devoted wife and three daughters, Mrs. Westley, Mrs. Frank Soward and Miss Grace Barrett.
