William S. Blake, part owner of the Globe Hotel, passed away in Wheatland Thursday night, September 24. The deceased had been ill for some months and had been confined to his bed for a long time.

Mr. Blake was born in Waterford, N.Y., October 22, 1869 and came to Wyoming 31 years ago. He was united in marriage to Helene Frederick in Cheyenne, April 12, 1902. To this union were born five children; Woodruff of Wheatland, Minnie of Flagstaff, Ariz.; Sara of Denver, William who preceded his father in death 13 years ago, and Peggy who is with her mother in Wheatland. He is also survived by one sister who resides in Genesco, N.Y.

He had been actively interested in the mining industry and lately a mica mine in the Sunrise district, in which he had an interest, has been worked by eastern men. He and his family had resided on a ranch on the Laramie river for 15 years. At that time he, with Joe Brown as a partner, purchased the Globe Hotel, in Wheatland, and he remained in this business until the time of his death.

Funeral services were held from the Copley Mortuary chapel Monday afternoon at 2:30 with Rev. R.E. Morgan of the Congregational church preaching the funeral sermon. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery.
