## mary Kezia Armann

Funeral services for former Wheatland resident, Mary Kezia Armann Bohmont, 99 years and 10 months, were held Saturday, Nov. 1, 1997 at 1:30 p.m. at the Wheatland United Methodist Church with Reverend Les Ludlam officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mrs. Bohmont died peacefully on Monday, Oct. 27, at the Castle Rock Convalescent Center in Green River, Wyo.

She was born Dec. 30, 1897, near Lincoln, Neb., the daughter of Abraham and Ella (Crozier) Armann. Mrs. Bohmont attended schools in Nebraska and majored in music at Nebraska Wesleyan University. She also took organ lessons at the University of Wyoming.

She married John Edward Bohmont in Martell, Neb., on March 20, 1918. They moved to the Laramie River Ranch in Wheatland, where they lived for 12 years, until John Division. They celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary in 1978.

Mrs. Bohmont taught hundreds of boys and girls piano and organ lessons for 46 years. She was the musician for many weddings, funerals, and entertainments in Platte County.

Mrs. Bohmont was member of the United Methodist Church for 85 years; was a Sunday school teacher for 20 years; and past president of the United Methodist Women. She was the organist for the United Methodist Church in Wheatland for 46 years; accompanied many soloists; and was the accompanist for the Platte County County Ladies Chorus. Mrs. Bohmont was a member of the Banner Rebekah Lodge #16, where she held many offices and was past Noble Grand. She was a member of the Wheatland Country Women's Club for 75 years, where she served as past president.

She was presented the Quealy Award from the University of Wyoming in 1950 for outstanding club work in Platte County. She served as secretary for 2 years for the pretigious Quealy Award Club. Mrs. Bohmont wrote pageants which were copyrighted and performed in Wyoming and Nebraska. She was Girl Scout leader for 3 years and was influential in the building of the 4-H Club building.

Mrs. Bohmont is survived by a son and daughter-inlaw, Drs. Dale and Marilyn Bohmont of Reno, Nev.; a daughter, Mildred Emerson of Green River; four grandchildren, Dennis Bohmont and wife, Lyn of Mission, S.D., Craig Bohmont of Lowell, Mass., Lachelle Boettcher and husband, Richard of Rock Springs, Wyo., and Caron DeMars of San Antonio, Texas; three great-grandchildren, Ryan, Scott, and Lyndsey Boettcher all of Rock Springs; and numerous nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her parents, husband, John on Nov. 22, 1980; and three brothers.
