George Washington Brandon, born in Salino, Ohio in 1874, passed away in the Wheatland General hospital September 20, following an illness of several weeks.

Mr. Brandon came to Wyoming in 1901 after spending three years along the Yukon river during the days of the gold rush. His original purpose was to mine for gold in the vicinity of the Dover post office, but he became interested in ranching, a vocation he pursued for eight years. In 1904, he was married to Mrs. Bessie Dover in Wheatland. A partnership with Mr. T.R. Shepard was formed in 1909 which, with the exception of three years spent in Ault, Colo., continued until his death. His meticulous honesty, his fine sense of justice, and his careful regard for his family will be a lasting memory to all those who knew him intimately.
