Dollie Anna Brawner, 79, died Monday, Sept. 14, 1981 at her home.

Dollie, the daughter of Thomas and Madama Creekmoore Zimmerman, was born Sept. 19, 1901 in Denver, Mo. She spent her early years in Missouri. At the age of 20 she moved to Wyoming to homestead in the Goshen Hole area with her brother, Carl. She met, and later married Herschel Brawner, a neighboring homesteader, on Sept. 1, 1922. They lived on Herschel's homestead until 1938. Then they moved to the Wheatland Flats and farmed until Herschel's death in 1951. Dollie remained on the farm a short time before moving to Wheatland where she was associated with Dr. Allison's hospital. She spent her retirement living with her daughter, Mildred. She is a past member of the Mother's Home Club.

She is survived by two daughters, Mildred Brawner and Zelma Duff, both of Wheatland; two brothers, Ray Zimmerman of Denver, Mo., and Carl Zimmerman of Denver, Colo.; seven grandchildren; and six great grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, Herschel, one son, Don, and three brothers, Ben, Charlie and Francis.

Services were held Thursday, Sept. 17, at 2 p.m. at the First Baptist Church with the Rev. Elton Bleeker officiating. Serving as pallbearers were Larry Snook, Keith Reich, Steven Cross, Albert Prather and Ed Musselman. Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery.
