BROWN, LYMAN ?-September 30, 1920

The body of Lyman Brown of Lingle was laid to rest in the Wheatland cemetery with military honors conducted by members of the local G.A.R. of which he was a member. Mr. Brown was widely known in this community and very highly esteemed. The Lingle Review gives the following report of his death:

Lyman Brown, 77 years of age, died suddenly at his home ten miles southwest of town on Wednesday morning, his demise being the result of heart failure. Mr. Brown got up in apparently his usual health on Wednesday morning, went about the place completing his morning work and ate his breakfast as usual. A little later he complained of feeling unwell. After a short time, Mrs. Brown went to him and found him dead.

Lyman Brown was a man of upright character and was much liked. His passing will be mourned by a large circle of warm friends.
