

Former Guernsey Resident Ruby Buchta Dies Of Wreck Injuries

Former Guernsey Resident,
Mrs. Ruby Edith Buchta, 59,
died Tuesday, February 15,
1972 at the Natrona County
Memorial Hospital in Casper
as a result of injuries sustained
in an automobile accident.

Mrs. Buchta, who lived in
Lander, received arm and leg
fractures and a crushed chest
when her car apparently went
out of control and crashed
into the Shawyer Hotel in Sho-
shoni. Firemen were called to
the scene to aid Patrolman Tim
Isabell in administering first aid
while awaiting arrival of the
ambulance from Riverton and
was then transferred to the hos-
pital in Casper.

She was born June 20, 1912,
in Chicago and with her par-
ents, Mr. and Mrs. Jack Dobbs,
moved to Nebraska and later to
Guernsey, where she finished
school. In 1947 she was joined
in marriage with Eddie Buchta
in Riverton. At the time of her
death she was employed at the
State Training School in Lan-
der.

She was a member of the
Eagles Auxiliary in Riverton &
the Sagebrush Extensioin Club
in Hiland.

Survivors include three daugh-
ters, Mrs. Merrill Selby, Armin-
to, Mrs. Phil Brekken, Powder
River and Mrs. Harry Marshall
of Denver; one sister, Mrs.
Betty Roso, Indian Harbor
Beach, Fla; and nine grandchil-
dren.

Funeral services were held
Friday, February 18 at the Bus-
tard Funeral Home in Casper,
with the Rev. George Hougham,
officiating. Graveside services
were held Friday at 3:00 p.m.
in the Wheatland Cemetery with
the Rev. Henry Hartberg offi-
ciating at the interment site.
