BULLOCK, CHESTER VAIL March 31, 1870-March 18, 1957

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock in the First Methodist Church for C.V. Bullock with Rev. B.B. Byus officiating. Mr. Bullock who would have been 87 on March 31, died in a local hospital Monday morning following declining health for over three years. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery.

Chester Vail Bullock was born in Nodaway, Ia. March 31, 1870, the second son of Mr. and Mrs. Hickman D. Bullock. He grew to manhood at Nodaway, took a business course at Quincy, Ill. and returned home to marry Mamie E. Courtright on Dec. 4, 1892.

He operated a general store at Nodaway for several years, later moving to Corning, Ia. to become a salesman for a wholesale grocery concern at Council Bluffs, Ia. The family lived in Logan, Ia.. and Blair, Nebr. before moving to Kimball, Nebr. in 1917. In 1932, Mr. and Mrs. Bullock moved to their homestead on the North Laramie river, and moved into Wheatland in 1942.

Surviving are his wife; one daughter, Mrs. Don Dey Ermand of Dalton, Nebr.; two sons, Cecil V. of Scottsbluff, Nebr. and Paul of Wheatland. Also surviving are five grandchildren and ten great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by three sisters and two brothers, and a daughter, Glenny.
