CALL, KATE O. BREAK February 2, 1874-April 15, 1935

Word was received here Tuesday a.m., that Mrs. Kate Call of Dwyer had passed away Monday night at the Loma Linda hospital near Redlands, Calif. The remains accompanied by her brother, Allen Break, arrived in Wheatland this morning, the funeral services were held at the Methodist church this afternoon at 2:30 with the Rev. Dwight M. Kitch in charge of the services at the church and the American Legion Auxiliary in charge of services at the grave. Interment took place in the Wheatland cemetery with the Lyla Watson Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

Pallbearers were members of Ora call Post, American Legion and were Dr. O.B. Wilson, Harold Duffy, W.B. Jones, E.H. McNall, Gardner Herrick and Orvil Bridgmon.

Editor's Note-the following obituary with necessary additions was written by the deceased shortly before her fatal illness:

Kate Break Call was born in Alorough County, Ontario, Canada, February 2, 1874, and passed away near Redlands, Calif., April 15th, 1935, age 61 years, 2 months and 13 days.

In early life she united with the New Mennonite church of which her parents were members. Later she moved with her parents to Kansas, where she was married to Will Call of Peabody, Kans. To this union were born three sons, Leonard of Dwyer, Earl of Florence, Kans., and Ora, the youngest son, who lost his life overseas, and in whose memory the Wheatland Post of American Legion is named.

In 1912 the family moved to Wyoming where they homesteaded 15 miles north of Wheatland. In June 1932 death claimed the husband and father.

Besides her sons, she is survived by five grandchildren, her aged father, two sisters, Mrs. Stella Donson and Mrs. Rose Hamilton all of Redlands, Calif., two brothers, Allen Break of Bryn Mawr, Calif., and Dave Break of Florence, Kans., two nieces, two nephews and a host of friends, who mourn her passing.
