Services for George Carroll, 98, who died in Wheatland Sept. 10, 1988, were held at 10:00 a.m. today in St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Wheatland, with Father Reid officiating.

Born June 13, 1890, in Palmyra, Mo., George was the son of Thomas and Margaret (Tulley) Carroll. He was raised in Missouri, moving west to Colorado in 1917, then on to Wyoming in 1918, at which time he farmed and ranched north of Worland.

In 1937 he and Mary Barkley were married in Missouri. They moved to Chugwater where they farmed until his retirement.

He was a veteran of World War I and a Chaplain and member of the American Legion for over 50 years.
