CARROLL, JAMES October 2, 1859-August 1921

The life of James Carroll came to an end at Casper, Saturday, from an attack of heart trouble which followed in the wake of other complications.

Mr. Carroll ranked among the early pioneers of this section having located at Ft. Laramie 44 years ago. For a time he was employed by the Teschmaker & Debillier Cattle outfit. Afterwards he was employed by an outfit in the Bull Bend district on the Platte river, north of the A.E. Ragan ranch, and also as foreman for the Gordon & Campbell outfit.

In 1889 he went to Montana and remained for ten years. At the expiration of that time, he returned to Wheatland and entered business with Thomas Carroll. He remained here until last year when he left for Casper and took up the grocery business, in which he was engaged at the time of his death.

He was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, Oct. 2, 1859. About fifteen years ago he returned to Cincinnati and married the wife who survives him. There was born to this union three sons, James, aged 13, Thomas, who died several years ago and Charles, aged 6 years.

The funeral was held at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday from the Catholic church, of which he was a communicant. Father Patterson of Douglas conducted the services. A considerable number of the old timers of this part of the country were in attendance.
