Miss Mary Price, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Price was born May 9 1844 at South Bend, Ind., and left for Denver, later Golden, Colo., with her parents on May 17, 1859, arriving in Denver, June 12, 1859. The Price family is reputed to have lived in the third log cabin built within the present site of Denver. Shortly thereafter the Prices moved to Golden where Mrs. Carrol spent her youth on the western border of civilization. Mr. Carrol saw service in the company M. 1st Colorado Volunteers which unit remained at home to protect the settlements from attacks of the Indians.
