But two hours earlier, Mr. Corbridge had talked to her over the phone and she then said she was feeling fine.

On Jan. 26., she gave birth to a daughter and since that time had been getting along very nicely. She had always been an unusually strong and healthy girl and woman and her sudden death seems to be one of those startling mysteries that are beyond human understanding.

Mrs. Corbridge had resided in this locality since girlhood. She was very widely known, respected and loved for her splendid Christian character and noble womanly qualities. The deep sympathy of the entire community goes out to the heart broken husband, family and motherless babe.
