

COURTRIGHT, JULIA E. CLIFFORD  
May 25, 1854-February 7, 1929

The funeral for Mrs. Julia Clifford Courtright, who died at Scottsbluff, Thursday, Feb. 7<sup>th</sup>, was held from the Methodist church, Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock with Rev. Orman C. King, preaching the funeral oration. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Watson Mortuary in charge of arrangements.

Julia Clifford Courtright was born in Big Rock, Iowa, May 25<sup>th</sup>, 1854, and passed from this life, February 7<sup>th</sup>, 1929, being 74 years, 8 months and 13 days of age. She was united in marriage to George A. Courtright, August 19<sup>th</sup>, 1873. To this union 9 children were born, six of whom survive the mother. Three boys passed away in infancy. Those living are: Mrs. C.V. Bullock, of Kimball, Nebr., Mrs. Frank Windom of Wheatland, Mrs. Minnie Jarman of Los Angles, Calif., C.G. Courtright of North Platte, Nebr., and Mrs. H.G. Barger of Scottsbluff, Nebr. She leaves 14 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren. Mrs. Courtright has been a member of the Methodist church since early girlhood.

She and her husband pioneered in western Iowa in the early '70's where they lived until 1903, when they moved to Wheatland, where her husband passed away January 22, 1907. The following year, Mrs. Courtright moved to Clarinda, Iowa, where she has since made her home. She made frequent visits among her children in Wyoming and Nebraska and it was while on a visit to her daughter, Mrs. Barger in Scottsbluff, that she quietly slipped away to her eternal home. Her many friends mourn the loss and join in sympathy with the loved ones.
