Services for Jack E. Criss, 96, who died in Wheatland
Nov. 19,1987, were held Monday, Nov. 23, 1987, at 10:30

a.m. in the Wheatland Bible Church with Father Kale King

officiating.

Criss was born Oct. 18, 1891, in Bolckow, Mo., the son of Madison and Flora Savage Criss. In 1916 he came to Wyoming and filed a homestead north of Uva. He entered the U.S. Army during World War I. Upon being discharged from the military he returned to Uva to operate his homestead and work for various ranchers.

He and Myrtle Yates were married in 1921 and operated the Cross T Ranch on the North Laramie River. In 1937 they moved to Mrytle's family's ranch on the Big Laramie River which he operated until his retirement. When the Grayrocks Dam was built on his property he moved into Wheatland.

He was a 50-year charter member of the American Legion and a life-time member of Wheatland Lodge AF & AM.

Survivors include sons Sunny Criss of Wheatland and Ed Criss of Reno, Nev.; daughters Wilma Jean Cutrell of Powell and Ruth Hoffman of Claymont, Del.; brother Walter Criss and sister Emma Thrasher, both of Savannah, Mo.; six grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his wife, five

brothers and two sisters.
