Funeral services for Robert W. Daly of Glendo will be held at the Schrader - Prell Chapel in Wheatland Wednesday, August 9, 1978 at 2:00 p.m. Dan Barcus will be officiating. Burial will be in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Robert Daly was born July 9, 1907 in Guernsey, and passed away August 5, 1978 at Natrona County Hospital in Casper after a long illness.

He was raised on the home ranch on the Laramie River and attended Wheatland Public Schools, graduating in 1925. He married Leona Anderson August 8, 1932 in Red Lodge, Montana.

Bob was a cowboy all of his younger years, riding in many rodeos and fulfilling his lifelong ambition of owning his own ranch. In 1946, the Dalys purchased the home place on the

Horseshoe Creek west of Glendo, in time adding to the ranch proper in both Platte and Converse Counties.

The Dalys reared three children on their ranch.

Bob Daly was active for 25 years in 4-H as a Leader and Dairy Superintendent for the County Fair. He was active in Farm Bureau, as an agent and a member, serving a number of years as President of the Glendo Local. He was Supervisor of the Glendo Soil Conservation District Board for six years. He was the County Coordinator for taking of the census in 1950. He worked for the Bureau of Reclamation from 1953 through 1969 as well as running his ranch. He acted as chaperone to the 4-H Roundup in Denver. He was a member of the Laramie River Council and the Powder River Basin Resource Council.

He is survived by his wife, Leona, of Glendo, one daughter, Patricia Archie of Glendo, and two sons, John Daly of Glendo and Dennis Daly of Douglas. He is also survived by two brothers, Chet and Pat Daly of Wheatland, three sisters, Minnie Persinger and Edith O'Brien, both of California and Emma Anderson of Seattle, Washington. Surviving also are seven grandchildren and many neices and nephews.

He was preceded in death by one sister, Mildered, one brother, Larry, and his parents.

The Robert Daly Memorial has been established to the Platte County 4-H, the proceeds of which will be used at the discretion of the Platte County 4-H Board.
