

DEERING, MAY CHARLOTTE DUNCAN
December 31, 1896-October 31, 1936

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon for Mrs. J.B. Deering who was suddenly taken from us Saturday, October 31st by the tragic death. Services were conducted at the Methodist church with Rev. J.L. Williams speaking the final words of comfort to the bereaved husband and friends.

The Eastern Stars conducted services at the church at the close of the regular service.

The Copley Funeral home was in charge of arrangements. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery.

May Charlotte Duncan was born December 31, 1896 in Delores, Colorado, was suddenly killed Oct. 31, 1936, age 39 years, 10 months. At the age of 10 years, she moved with her parents to Cortez, Colorado, grew to womanhood at that place. She went to Seattle, Washington in 1928 and spent two years there caring for an uncle. She was married to James B. Deering on March 25, 1930 at Torrington, Wyoming. After her marriage, she resided at Guernsey for about 15 months, before moving to Wheatland.

Became affiliated with the Presbyterian church at Durango, Colo., in April, 1914. She was a member of the order of Eastern Stars. Also a member of Neighbors of Woodcraft, was a past president of the American Legion Auxiliary, was present secretary of Community Chest. Had just recently organized the Junior Auxiliary of the American Legion. Was a member of the Business Girls club and the W.T.K. club.
