

# One Car Accident Takes Life Of Julius Dobbs, 80, Of Guernsey

Julius Neuman Dobbs, age 80, of Guernsey was dead on arrival at the Lusk Hospital, in a one car accident, Oct. 10, 1970, 9 miles south of Lusk.

Mr. Dobbs was a former Railroad Engineer for the CB&Q Railroad for 45 years, and a resident of Guernsey since 1918. He was born in Rockford, Nebr. November 3, 1889, and was a member of the Guernsey AF and AM, Knights Templar, Wyoming Consistory No. 1, Korein Shrine and was affiliated with the Presbyterian church.

His first wife, Edith preceded him in death December 15, 1941 and his second wife Helen, died March 1, 1963. He is survived by one son, John K. Dobbs of Lakewood, Calif. Three daugh-

ters, Mrs. Paul Hague, of Denver; Mrs. Ruby Buchta of Riverton; and Mrs. Ruby Ross of Indiana Harbour, Fla. Twelve brothers and sisters preceded him in death. He had 10 grandchildren and 25 great grandchildren.

Services were held in the United Presbyterian Church at Guernsey with Rev. Paul Moyer officiating Oct. 15 (today), burial was at the Wheatland cemetery with Masonic graveside services.
