

Philip Lloyd Dumars

March 12, 1948 – June 28, 2006

Funeral services for Philip Lloyd Dumars, 58, were at 10 a.m. last Friday at the First Christian Church in Wheatland, with Bishop Doug Hinkle of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints of Wheatland, Grant Lindstrom of Laramie, and Glenn Bugher of Rhema Fellowship of Torrington, officiating. Interment with military honors accorded were in the Wheatland Cemetery.

He died Wednesday, June 28, 2006, at the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Cheyenne, Wyoming, after a long illness.

Philip was born March 12, 1948, in Malone, New York, the son of Dorothy (Wood) and Lyle A. Dumars. Shortly after graduating from Salmon River Central High School in New York, he joined the United States Navy and served in Vietnam from September 1966 to July 1970. He was released with an honorable discharge. After the Navy, he became active in the Wheatland Fire Department and Emergency Management and was an instructor for both as well as an instructor for child safety seats. He was the Town of Wheatland's Emergency Manager from 1991 until his death. He liked to go fishing and camping and was very

active in the Mormon Church. In March 1991, he married Delorse K. Lambert.

Survivors include his wife of Wheatland; mother of Moira, NY; a son, Deshaun of Sweetwater, Texas; a daughter, Tanya Romero and husband of Alpine, Texas; three sisters, Dorothy Williams and family of Matone, NY, Debbie Powers and family and Valerie Dumars all of Moira; three brothers, Lloyd Dumars and family of Peru, NY, Lyle Dumars and family of Dexter, NM; and Craig Dumars and family of Moira; three stepdaughters, Audrey Hobbs and family and Alice Clark and family all of Cheyenne, and Deanna Darnell of Wheatland; one step-son, Ricky Morris and family of Torrington; three grandchildren; and four step grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his father.
