## DUNHAM, WILLIS M. December 14, 1859-November 10, 1930

On Monday, November 10<sup>th</sup>, death again entered the Dunham family for the third time in less than six months, taking from the circle Willis M. Dunham, who was born in Erie county, Pennsylvania, December 14<sup>th</sup>, 1859.

When 20 years of age Mr. Dunham went to Kansas, where on the 17<sup>th</sup> of April 1880, he was married to Miss Dema Tucker. To them were born seven children, six of who survive him, one Mrs. Jessie Thompson, having died on July 22, 1930. Those living are, R.A. Dunham, Mills, Wyoming; Mrs. Linna Caruer, Boone, Iowa; Mrs. Minnie Siebert, Mrs. Pearl Michaelis, Mrs. Frances Curtis, John Dunham, and an adopted daughter, Anna, all of Wheatland, Wyoming. In addition to these he is survived by his widow, Mrs. W.M. Dunham, a brother, S.A. Dunham, Bonnerville, Kansas, thirteen grandchildren and several other relatives. He united with the United Bretheran church in Hardtner, Kansas, in 1895. He came with his family to Wheatland in 1914, taking up a homestead 10 miles east of Wheatland which has since been his home. Mr. Dunham was highly respected by all who knew him. He had been ill for several months.

Funeral services were held from the Christian church on Wednesday with Rev. Cecil Smith in charge and burial was in the Wheatland cemetery with the Watson Mortuary in charge.
