## FAULKNER, RILEY May 21, 1852-October 30, 1934

Riley Faulkner passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. J.W. Blevins of the Greyrocks community, Tuesday morning after an illness of long standing.

Funeral services were held from the Blevins farm home Wednesday afternoon with Rev. C.L. Morton in charge of the services. Interment was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Lyla Watson Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Faulkner was born in Stanton, Ky., May 21, 1852 and left Powell country with his parents for St. James, Mo., in March, 1861. He lived there until 1916 when he moved to Wyoming.

November 1, 1874, he was married to Miss Jemima Cooper at St. James and to this union, 12 children were born, 11 of them surviving his demise. Mr. Faulkner had been a life long member of the Baptist church.

Besides his wife who has been in poor health for a number of years, he is survived by 8 sons and 3 daughters.
