

FISH, BLANCHE JOHNSON
July 20, 1883-February 3, 1940

Mrs. Blanche Fish, one of Platte County's prominent citizens, passed away suddenly Saturday, February 3, twenty-four hours after she was stricken with a cerebral hemorrhage.

Mrs. Fish who was born July 20, 1883 at Yarmouth, Iowa, had been a resident of Wheatland for the past twenty-eight years. She was married to Dr. Charles E. Fish December 25, 1912, he preceding her in death five years ago this month.

Mrs. Fish was active in the affairs of the community, being a past matron of the local Eastern Star, a charter member of Chapter R of the P.E.O., life-time member of the W.T.K. club and a member of the Phi Beta Phi mothers' club at the University of Wyoming. She also served on the school board here a number of years.

Surviving are her daughter, Betty Wanic, two sisters, Miss Mayme Johnson of Wheatland and Mrs. E.M. Westner of Burlington, Iowa, a brother, Charles, also of Burlington, besides other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 at the Masonic Temple. Short services were conducted by Rev. C.B. Doughty of the local Methodist church, after which the Eastern Star took charge. Interment was made in the Wheatland Cemetery, with Watson and Dennis in charge of arrangements.
