

Marvin Fisher

Funeral Services for Marvin Fisher, 73, were held Monday, April 26, 1993, at 10:00 a.m. at the New Testament Christian Church with John Owens officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mr. Fisher was born November 5, 1919 in Sidney, Nebraska. He was raised in the Platte Valley Nebraska area.

He served in the Air Force during World War II. After being discharged, he returned to farming. On March 30, 1914, he married Dorothy Cooper of Scottsbluff. They farmed in Nebraska until March of 1951 and then moved to Wheatland where they farmed until retiring in 1986. At this time, they moved to Cheyenne.

He is survived by his wife, Dorothy and daughter, Alice Wichert and her husband Lavern of Wheatland and a son, Randy of Cheyenne.

Other survivors include Verna Monk of Yutan, Nebraska; three grandchildren of Wheatland and numerous nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents, one grandson Christopher, and three brothers.
