GERINGER, BRYAN LEE February 1, 1979-August 1, 1998

A one vehicle roll over southeast of Wheatland Saturday, August 1, claimed the life of Bryan Lee Geringer, 19, of Wheatland.

According to the Wyoming Highway Patrol, Geringer was northbound on Bellis Road at 3:45 a.m. when his 4-wheel drive Chevorlet Cheyenne 1500 pick-up veered off the road. Geringer overcorrected to the left and then the right. The pick-up then struck a power pole and an irrigation channel, rolling and ejecting Geringer. The pick-up and Geringer came to rest on Wyoming Highway 316, Antelope Gap Road.

Geringer, who died at the scene, was not wearing a seatbelt and reports estimate his speed at over 60 mph. Officers are awaiting toxicology results, but suspect alcohol was a factor in the crash.

Power in that area was disrupted for approximately three hours as crews awaited daylight to replace the power pole.

Geringer is the son of Fred and Jerelyn Geringer of Wheatland and had recently started a custom harvesting business with his cousin, Jason Goertz. He is survived by his parents and sisters, Nicole and husband Sean Albertson and Karen Sue and husband Matt Grant. Services were held Tuesday, August 4 at the United Church of Christ in Wheatland. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

The Wyoming Highway Patrol is still investigating the crash.
