## An old Citizen passed away

Mr. 'Chauency Goodrich better known as Grandpa Goodrich died at the family home Tuesday (Feb 1, 1921) morn. Mr Goodrich has been gradually failing in health for more than a year. The past few weeks he suffered a great deal and the end was not unexpected. There was no moaning at the bar when he put out to sea, but a calm peace because he had gone to be with the father. There was no dread of death for he longed to go. His was a simple abiding faith that sustained him here and held out a sure hope for eternity.

Mr. Goodrich was born in Whitley County, Indiana, Oct 7, 1839. So new was Indiana at that time that he was the third child to be born in the county. A sister and brother survive him. On July 24, 1841 he was united in marriage to Miss Rhoda Noble of Larwell, Indiana. To this union were born three children. They are Mrs. Rita Jameson, Mr Clement Goodrich and Mr Charles Goodrich all of this place.

In 1856 the family moved to Colorado near Ft. Collins, in 1895 the family again moved and this time to the Wheatland Colony.

In the passing of Chauency Goodrich Wheatland looses on of its oldest and most esteemed citizens. He was a contractor and brick layer by trade. With his own hands he *numbered* in laying bricks in nearly every business house in town.

For more than fifty years he was an active member of the Methodist Church. His father was a minister and he himself held the official relation of class leader until his decease. He was humble, patient, thoughtful and devout. There are many more Christian virtues that could be enumerated in his life but those are enough to show that his life was not in vain. What ever talents he possessed in prayer or speech or song were used to make the world a little better and brighter.

The funeral service will be held from the Methodist Church Thursday after noon at 2:00. Interment will take place in the city Cemetery (Feb 3, 1921)
