## Haggerty Brothers Killed In One Car Accident East Of Casper Tuesday Funeral services for Richard Were thrown out of the pickup.

Funeral services for Richard Charles Haggerty 18, Wheatland and Michael Haggerty, 11, of the Hat Six Ranch, Casper will be held Saturday, August 26, 1972, at 1:30 p.m. at the United Church of Christ. With Rev. Roger Stiers and Rev. James Harvey officiating. Burial will be at the Wheatland Cemetary.

The brothers were killed Tuesday, Aug., 22, 1972, when the driver of the pickup truck, Richard Haggerty, apparently lost control and the truck plunged over the right side of the road into a 40-ft. ravine, on the Hat Six Road east of Casper. All three of the brothers

were thrown out of the pickup. Frank Haggerty, of the Hat Six, is listed in critical condition in the Natrona County Hospital. He suffered a broken right lower leg and other injuries.

Michael Haggerty was born in Wyoming on March 4, 1961 and was a student.
