In 1971, they sold their farm and bought a mountain ranch west of Wheatland. They sold the ranch in 1978 after buying a ranch near Chugwater in 1973.

In 1990, she convinced him to retire and they bought a home near Wheatland.

He enjoyed hunting Indian artifacts while he was out fixing fence or working on the ranch. He also planted trees and improved all of the land they owned.

Survivors include his wife of Wheatland, four children, David Harris of Glenrock, Karen Vallee of Cheyenne, Steve Harris of Wheatland and Stanley Harris of Pine Bluffs; a brother, Charles Harris of Forsythe, Mont.; two sisters, Norma Streit of Guide Rock, Neb., and Hazel Sherard of Sheridan and six grandchildren.
