Anna was preceded in death by her parents; husband, Michael, in 1981; brother, Edward Nobis; and sisters, Helen Capone and Mary Colyer.

She is survived by her children, Joanne M. (Thomas) Foster of Wheatland and Michael C. Hegarty of Torrington, Wyoming; sister, Edith Doyon of Vero Beach, Florida; grandchildren, Thomas Foster Jr. of Billerica, Massachusetts and Michelle A. Pulos of Torrington; and

great grandchildren, Anthony Gello and Michelle Gello both of Casper, Wyoming and Rebecca Foster of Billerica.
