Francisco Herrera, Mexican beet tender on the Lester Cobb farm, died Monday morning of tuberculosis, after an illness beginning with pneumonia and lasting about two months.

Herrera was forty years of age, and came here from Zacetecas in Old Mexico, where his family of a wife and five children now live. A physician had gone to the Cobb farm in company with the field superintendent A.R. Williams with a view to pronouncing on Herrera's fitness to be taken by train to his home at Zacetecas, in the hope that a warmer climate might permit his recovery. Arrangements had been made to start him on his journey Monday, when a sudden turn for the worse resulted in his death.

Herrera's only relative here is a brother who works at Uva. He was buried Tuesday afternoon, the Great Western Sugar Company arranging the funeral.
