He was a lobbyist for six years, and was one of the people responsible for getting the statewide weed and pest acts passed. He was a member of the Wheatland Jaycees for several years.

Hohnholt is survived by his wife Bonnie of Wheatland, sons Mark and Mike of Wheatland, daughter-in-law Alana Hohnholt of Wheatland, brother Clyde of Saudia Arabia and granddaughter Kaitlin Hohnholt of Wheatland.

He was preceded in death by his parents and grand aughter Bailey Hohnholt.
