HOLLINGSWORTH, WILLIAM CURTIS September 7, 1861-March 7, 1942

W.C. Hollingsworth was born September 7, 1861, in Milo, Iowa, and passed away in Wheatland, Saturday, March 7, 1942. He was the youngest son of Levi and Anna Hollingsworth and had five brothers and one sister, all of whom have preceded him in death.

March 19, 1885, he was married to Ida R. Hightower and lived on their farm near Milo, Iowa, for fifteen years. In 1900, the Hollingsworths moved to Wheatland.

In 1906, Mrs. Hollingsworth's brother and wife passed away leaving a son two and one half years old which Mr. and Mrs. Hollingsworth took to raise and some will recall that this boy, Charlie, was one of the first four to graduate from the Wheatland high school.

W.C. Hollingsworth (Curt, as he was known to his friends) accepted Christ as his Savior Oct. 8, 1887 and united with the Christian Union Church, living a faithful christian life through these years. His last words gave assurance of this spirit and faith: "In my Father's house are many mansions...and I know he has one for me". He had reached the age of eighty years and six months.
