Mr. Hooley died Saturday, September 28, 2002, at United Medical Center-West in Cheyenne. Stanley was born February 29, 1924, in Denver, Colorado, the son of Ivan Stanley and Nellie Marie (Thurman) Hooley. He was reared and educated in the Cassa Community south of Glendo, and graduated from Glendo High School. Stanley served in the United States Navy during World War II from December 22, 1943 to April 24, 1946. While in the service, he met his wife, Krysteen McLucas, who was also serving in the United States Navy. After Mr. Hooley returned from serving overseas, he and Krysteen were married in Wheatland on November 26, 1945.

Upon being discharged, they made their home

on a ranch at Cassa for 34 years. They moved to Wheatland in December of 1977 and Stanley worked briefly at the Safeway Store and then worked until retiring as supervisor for Platte County road and Bridge in 1984.

He enjoyed watching sports on television, especially football. Stanley was well liked by all who knew him.

He is survived by a son, Alax "Spencer" Hooley of Wheatland and a brother, Quentin Hooley of Torrington.

Stanley was preceded in death by his parents; wife, Krysteen on July 25, 2002; and a brother, Kenneith Hooley on January 24, 2001.
