

HOWE, HAROLD PAUL
February 9, 1919-February 15 , 1951

Harold Howe, resident of Platte county for 22 years, died Thursday, February 15, at a local hospital.

Last rites were conducted at 2 o'clock Sunday in the Wheatland Baptist church, with the Rev. J.B. Milstead officiating. Military services were conducted at the graveside in the Wheatland cemetery by the Chugwater American Legion. Arrangements were made by Schrader's.

Born February 9, 1919 in Indianola, Nebr., Howe came to this country 22 years ago. He was a member of the Baptist church, a veteran of World War II, a member of the American Legion, and the Wyoming Farm Bureau Federation.
