They operated that ranch and when he passed away in 1969, she continued to ranch until 1972 when she retired to Wheatland. She was a member of the Order of Eastern Star, the Wyo-

ming Stockgrowers, the United Methodist Church, and a 50-

year member of the Country Women's Club.

She is survived by son James Irvine and daughter Francel Rietz, both of Wheatland, and by 4 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren.

Besides her parents and husband, she was preceded in

death by 13 brothers and sisters.
