Man slain outside Wheatland bar

WHEATLAND (AP) — A Wheatland man died Saturday morning after apparently being shot in the parking lot of a bar, ac-

cording to police.

The Wheatland Police Department, in a news release, said the unidentified man, age 39, died early Saturday morning after he was found shot at about 7:45 p.m. Friday night in the Wheatland parking

The release said the man was

found when police responded to a request for emergency aid at the bar. It added preliminary investigations indicated a firearm may have been involved in the incident.

The release said the man's name would not be released until all of his relatives had been noti-

fied.

The incident is being investigated by the Wheatland Police Department and the Platte County Coroner's office.
