

Lucille Ellen Kafka

Services for Lucille Ellen Kafka, 74, who died in Casper Sept. 14, 1987, were held in the Wheatland Bible Church at 2 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 16, 1987, with Pastor Gordon Swedberg officiating.

Born Jan. 31, 1913, in Phillips, Neb., Lucille was the daughter of Raynold and Mattie (Baker) Barrett. When she was 6 years old her family moved to Albany Co. where they homesteaded. She attended school in that area until 1925.

The family then moved to the Wheatland Flats and she attended school in Wheatland, graduating from Wheatland High School.

In 1933 she and John Kafka were married in Wheatland. They ranched the family homestead, moving into Wheatland six years ago to spend their retirement years.

She attended the Wheatland Bible Church, was a member of the Golden Age and Toltec Clubs and played in the Kitchen Band.

Survivors include her husband John of Wheatland, two daughters: Erma Brooks of Denver, Jean Hanks of Wheatland; a brother, Erwin Barrett of Garrett; a sister, Myrtle Davis of Wheatland and five grandchildren.

Besides her parents, she was preceded in death by a son, Larry, two brothers and one sister.
