KENTY, DANIEL 1848-September 13, 1922

D. Kenty, for a quarter century a resident of the Wheatland colony, 74 years of age, and well-known among the old-timers of this part of Wyoming, was thrown from a load of wood by a runaway team, Wednesday at 11:30 a.m. sustaining injuries from which he died at the Wheatland hospital three hours later.

The accident occurred two miles east of the Muleshoe ranch, when he was on his way home with his load. A telephone wire was being stretched across the highway, and when the team came upon this, they reared back breaking the neck yoke. They started to run and this threw Mr. Kenty from the load, a distance of ten or twelve feet. He struck on his head, shoulders and hip, sustaining a fracture of the skull at the base of the brain, injuries to the spine and severe bruises. Little hope was entertained for his recovery from the time he was picked up. No arrangements have been completed as yet for the funeral.

Deceased leaves a wife and six children. The children are: Miss Bertha at home, Mrs. Arthur Chase of Wheatland, Mrs. Claude Hinds of Casper, Mrs. L.D. Dorman of Worland, Mrs. F.H. Brainard of Los Angles, Roy residing on the west coast and William of Worland. The children have been notified.
