KIPFINGER, ADAM L. 1863-February 9, 1924

The Wheatland farming community was poorer for the loss of an upright popular citizen with the death of Adam L. Kipfinger, who departed this life, Friday, February 9th and was laid to rest in the Wheatland cemetery Sunday with Masonic orders.

Mr. Kipfinger had been in poor health for many years, but his death was immediately due to freezing his feet last winter. His physical condition was such that his feet did not heal, and gangrene set in, finally spreading thru his system.

He was born in Pendleton, New York, in 1863. He came to Wheatland 23 years ago, and located on his farm southwest of Wheatland. He was for many years a leading grange worker here, and prominent in farmers' movements. He joined the I.O.O.F. and Masonic lodges.

The latter organization conducted his funeral, the Masonic ritual being read both at the funeral service at the Congregational church and at the cemetery. Pallbearers were George Richardson, Frank Trenholm, E.T. Hall, T.A. Shaw, G.T. Goodrich, W.L. Davis, D.W. Brice and Ben Mitchell. The funeral service was given by Rev. Paxton.
