

Ted Kuehner

Passes Away

Funeral services were held on Saturday, November 23, for Teddy L. "TK" Kuehner age 45, who passed away at the Platte County Memorial Hospital on November 20, 1985.

Services were held at the First Christian Church in Wheatland with Chet Shaw officiating. Wheatland Lodge No. 1636 held a memorial service in the church.

Teddy Kuehner was born in Wheatland on July 31, 1940, and was the son of Frank and Virginia Kuehner. He received his education in the Wheatland Schools and had the distinction of receiving the first Trainers Scholarship ever presented from the University of Wyoming.

Teddy worked for many years at the Wheatco in Wheatland and as the manager of the Moose Lodge Club.

He was an avid sports fan, and was active in Babe Ruth and American Legion Baseball, first as a player and then as a manager in later years. Teddy was always very supportive of the high school sports and the Wheatland Youth Baseball Association. For many years he was known as "The Voice of the Bulldogs" on KYCN Radio. His column in the Town Crier, "TK On Sports" was widely read.

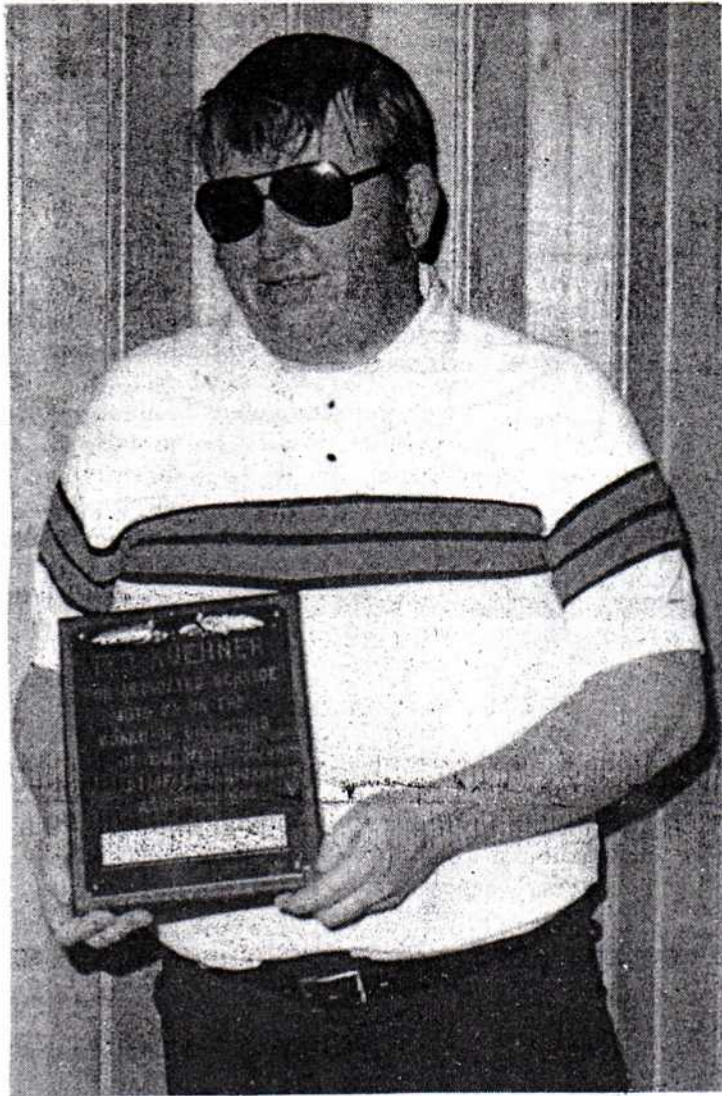
In the past year Teddy was presented with an appreciation plaque from the Wyoming State Bowling Assn., he was selected for the Concern for Kids Laramie Dell Club Award, as well as the 1985 Outstanding Citizen Award from the Kiwanis Club.

Teddy held the office of Trustee on the Moose Lodge Board of Directors and in previous years held the office of Outer Guard.

He was preceded in death by his mother.

Survivors include his father and step-mother, Frank and Margaret Kuehner of Wheatland; his sister, Roberta Tibbets of Elko, Nevada; and two nephews.
