LINDEMAN, HERMAN HENRY February 8, 1881-December 21, 1976

Funeral services were held Thursday, December 23, 1976, for Rev. Herman Henry Lindeman at the United Church of Christ in Wheatland. Services were conducted by Rev. Gordon Tritchler and Dr. Robert Inglis. Arrangements were made by the Schrader-Prell Funeral Home.

Rev. Lindeman passed away Tuesday, December 21, 1976, at the Platte County Memorial Hospital Nursing Wing.

He was born in Seneca, Kansas, February 8, 1881 and spent his childhood in Milford, Nebraska. He attended the University of Nebraska where he received both his B.A. and M.A. Degrees. Following college, he taught school for five years then entered Yale Divinity School. He served as student minister at Iowa State College in Ames, Iowa.

He then moved to Yankton, South Dakota where he received a Pastorate and also taught religion at Yankton College for eighteen years. He received his Doctor of Divinity from Yankton College in 1927.

For ten years, he also was Superintendent of the Congregational Conference of the Central South.

Upon retiring from this position he served churches in Bingor, Oklahoma and Douglas before retiring to Wheatland and has resided here for 16 years.

In death, he is survived by his wife, Bessie of Wheatland; two sons, Dr. George M. Lindeman of Colorado Springs, Colo. and Dr. Ted Lindeman of Springfield, South Dakota; two daughters, Mrs. Miriam Parsons of Creed, Colo. and Mrs. Jean Landen of Wheatland; 15 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren. Two brothers and one sister preceded him in death.

A memorial through the First National Bank of Wheatland has been established to the Yankton College, Yankton, South Dakota.
