

Arch Marker Dies Monday, May 8th

Welf-known passiessman and longtime resident, Arch R. Marker succumbed Monday, May 8, 1972 at the Platte County Memorial Hospital following an extended illness.

Born in Shelby, Nebraska January 2, 1908, he had been a resident of Wheatland for the past 36 years. He was united in marriage with Viola Rischling May 7, 1930 at Tecumseh, Nebraska. A veteran of World War II, he opened Markers, Inc. in February of 1946 after his discharge from the service.

Besides a host of many friends in and around Wheatland, Mr. Marker is survived by his wife, Viola Marker, Wheatland; two sons, Ron Marker of Casper and Dick Marker of Wheatland; his father, J. R. Marker, Wheatland; one brother, Carl Marker, Wheatland and six grandchildren. One son, one daughter, his mother and one sister preceded him in death.

Funeral services were held Thursday, May 11, 1972 at the Schrader Chapel at 2:00 p.m. with the Rev. Henry Hartberg officiating. Interment was at the Wheatland Cemetery and serving as pallbearers were John Baker, Lingle; Charles Spangler; Joe Bookout; O. D. Howe, Longmont, Colo.; Frank Robinson and Warren Stuckey. Masonic services were held at the graveside.
