Jane Scott McCletland was born at Lesmahago, Lanarkshire, Scotland on Feb. 1, 1839 and died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Albert Cobb, the morning of June 18, 1921, aged 82 years, 4 months and 17 days.

Her parents came to America during the summer following her birth and settled in Trumble county, Ohio on a small tract of uncleared forest land, and with the indomitable courage bequeathed by their ancestors who stood as adamant for God and the right during those terrible days to early Scottish history known as "The Killing Time" began the task of wresting a living for themselves and their family from this little tract "forest primeval".

On May 24, 1868, she was united in marriage to Corydon B. McClelland. To this union were born five children, one daughter dying in infancy. One son, Herbert L., and the husband have also gone to the promised land.

There are left to mourn her departure, one son, R.A. McClelland of Santa Rosa, Calif., and two daughters, Mrs. Dr. A.N. Cook of La Mesa, Calif., and Mrs. Albert Cobb of Wheatland, Wyo., with their families and a host of friends.

Accepting Christ as her Savior at an early age, she was ever a faithful and consistent follower of her Lord and Master, her chief delight being to engage in church and Sunday school work and kindred activities.
